West Virginia's Health Homes Program is designed to meet your needs so you get quality care. Your medical care can be managed with other services to keep you healthy.



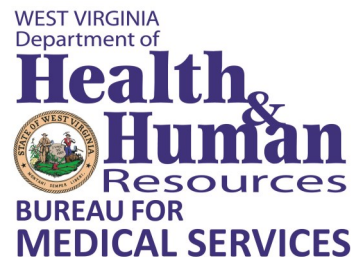

The Basics

A Health Home is not a place where you live. It is a team of people who help you manage your health care needs. The goal of West Virginia Health Homes is to help you be your healthiest and in control of your life.

This program is for Medicaid members who are diagnosed with a chronic condition. In a Health Home, a team of professionals will coordinate and provide your health care. West Virginia Health Homes is currently open to members diagnosed with Bipolar Disorder and have or are at risk of having Hepatitis B or C (see “Who is Eligible” for complete information).

There is no cost to you for Health Home services.



A Health Home Team Helps You:

- Manage your medical conditions and medications.
- Remember your appointments.
- Find providers and specialists.
- Understand your medical tests and results.
- Follow and understand provider instructions.
- Work with providers and specialists to help you get healthy and stay healthy.
- Learn how to prevent illnesses or complications.
- Answer health questions and listens to your concerns.
- Find transportation to medical appointments.

Your team includes you, your primary care provider and other care providers, and may also include community supports.

Your team is centered around you and your health. Your team will work with you to make the best decisions on your health as possible.

Who is Eligible?

West Virginia Medicaid members who are diagnosed with Bipolar Disorder and have or are at risk of having Hepatitis B or C may be eligible for Health Home services.

You must also be receiving services from a provider in the following counties:

- Cabell
- Kanawha
- Mercer
- Putnam
- Raleigh
- Wayne

Health Homes plans to expand to additional chronic conditions in the near future.
